Binding Theory

Binding theory accounts for the distribution of nominal expressions. Three basic types of nominal expressions are distinguished:

- 1. R-expressions (i.e. nouns)
- 2. anaphors (i.e. reflexive pronouns)
- 3. pronouns (i.e. personal pronouns)

Describe the distribution of the three types of expressions based on the following examples:

- (1) **John** likes Mary.
- (2) $*He_1$ likes **John**₁.
- (3) $*He_1$ thinks that I like **John**₁.
- (4) **He** likes Mary.
- (5) $*John_1$ likes him_1 .
- (6) John₁ thinks that I like him_1 .
- (7) John₁ likes $himself_1$.
- (8) John₁ believes $himself_1$ to be sick.
- (9) *John₁ thinks that I like **himself**₁.

Consider now the sentences in (10) to (12). Modify your description of the distributional properties such that it also accounts for these sentences.

- (10) *John's₁ mother likes John₁.
- (11) **John's**₁ mother likes him_1 .
- (12) *John's₁ mother likes himself₁.
