

Binding Theory

Binding theory accounts for the distribution of nominal expressions. Three basic types of nominal expressions are distinguished:

1. R-expressions (i.e. nouns)
2. anaphors (i.e. reflexive pronouns)
3. pronouns (i.e. personal pronouns)

Describe the distribution of the three types of expressions based on the following examples:

- (1) **John** likes Mary.
- (2) *He₁ likes **John**₁.
- (3) *He₁ thinks that I like **John**₁.
- (4) **He** likes Mary.
- (5) *John₁ likes **him**₁.
- (6) John₁ thinks that I like **him**₁.
- (7) John₁ likes **himself**₁.
- (8) John₁ believes **himself**₁ to be sick.
- (9) *John₁ thinks that I like **himself**₁.

Consider now the sentences in (10) to (12). Modify your description of the distributional properties such that it also accounts for these sentences.

- (10) ***John's**₁ mother likes **John**₁.
- (11) **John's**₁ mother likes **him**₁.
- (12) ***John's**₁ mother likes **himself**₁.
