

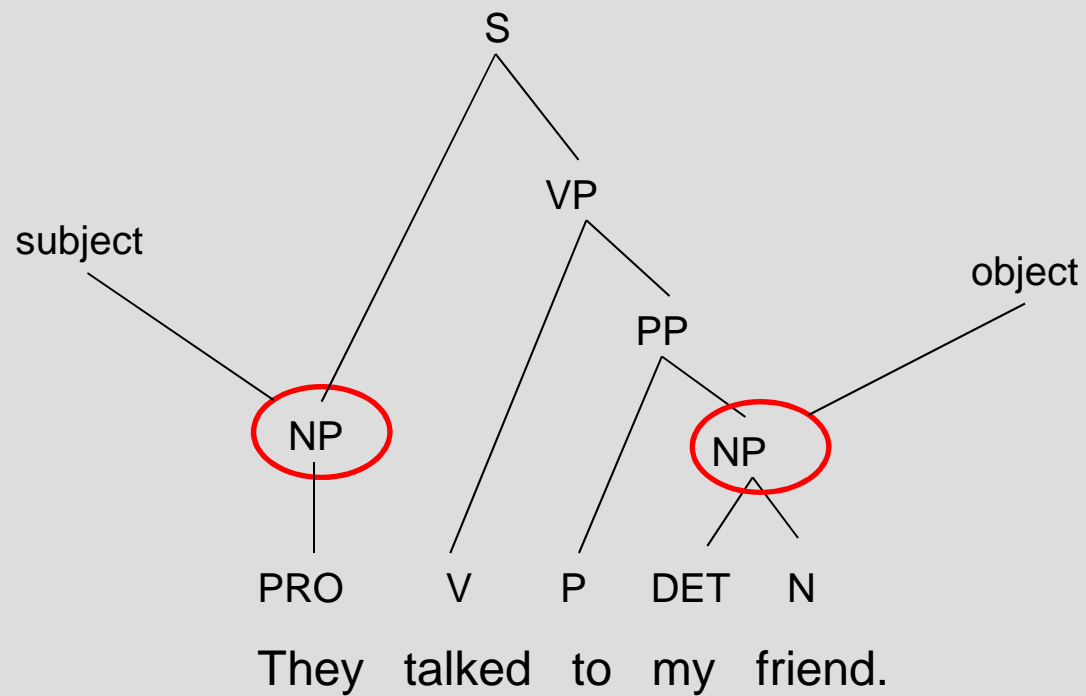

Adverb type	Eliciting question	Examples
Manner adverb	How?	<i>well, nicely, cleverly</i>
Place adverb	Where?	<i>here, there, everywhere</i>
Direction adverb	Where to? Where from?	<i>up, back, forward, home</i>
Time- <i>when</i> adverb	When?	<i>then, once, tonight, soon</i>
Duration adverb	How long?	<i>long, briefly, always</i>
Frequency adverb	How often?	<i>always, often, usually</i>
