

Coordination




- $\mathsf{S} \qquad \rightarrow \quad \mathsf{NP} \; \mathsf{VP}$
- $\mathsf{NP} \longrightarrow (\mathsf{DET}) (\mathsf{A}) \mathsf{N} (\mathsf{PP})$
- $\mathsf{PP} \quad \rightarrow \quad \mathsf{P} \, \mathsf{NP}$
- $\mathsf{VP} \quad \rightarrow \quad \mathsf{V} \; (\mathsf{NP}) \; (\mathsf{PP})$
- $\mathsf{AP} \quad \rightarrow \quad (\mathsf{ADV}) \, \mathsf{A}$


